Jeremiah 17:1 - The sin of Judah is being engraved [בַּחַבְּבּׁלּגּמּלּא: Qal passive participle: sin receives the action of being written in stone] with an iron chisel [בַּבּיׁב 'et: a stylus] and inscribed [שֹבְיּב charash: to engrave metal] with a diamond [בּבּיִב shamir: flint, emery, or adamant stone] tip on the tablets [בַּבְּיִב luach: stone tablet] of their hearts and the horns [בְּבִיב qeren: brass projections on the corners of altars] of their altars [these actions imply volitional choice].

v. 2 - Their <u>children</u> [] <u>ben</u>: children in general] <u>remember</u> [] <u>zachar</u>: memory pertains to places & objects to which the one remembering clings (Jer 17:2)] their altars and their sacred poles dedicated to the goddess Asherah [the Baal cult], set up beside the green trees on the high hills.
