The eight gates are:

Gate 1. The filling of the Holy Spirit: Mandated in Ephesians 5:18, every believer is ordered to execute God's plan by means of imputed divine power, never human energy.

Fellowship with the Trinity Fellowship: koinonia

Liddell, Henry G. and Robert Scott. Greek-English Lexicon, s.v. "koinonia":

To take part in a thing with another; partnership; common enterprise.

Arndt, William F. and F. Wilber Gingrich. Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament, s.v. "koinonia":

Association; close relationship.

Fellowship is described in relationship to all three members of the Trinity. The Christian way of life is fellowship with God Who is invisible.

Fellowship with God the Father is found in:

1 John 1:6 - If we say we have fellowship with Him [God; see 1 John 1:5] and yet walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice [poieo: lifestyle of virtue] the truth.

This documents that fellowship with God is experienced whenever we make application of doctrine to life, i.e., "practice the truth."

Fellowship with the Father inevitable leads to personal love for God at spiritual adulthood. This thus develops into the problem-solving device #7.

Fellowship with Jesus Christ is found in:

1 Corinthians 1:9 - God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

This develops into occupation with Christ which is problem-solving device #10.

Fellowship with the Holy Spirit is mentioned in:

Philippians 2:1 - If there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any comfort in virtue love, if there is any fellowship with the Holy Spirit ...

Philippians 2:2 - bring to completion my happiness, that you might be thinking the same things.

2 Corinthians 13:14 - The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

The "fellowship of the Holy Spirit" refers to the filling of the Holy Spirit, commanded in Ephesians 5:18, and is problem-solving device #2.

Fellowship with the Holy Spirit means two things:

- a. Filling of the Holy Spirit, the "on" switch to the divine power system and access to all the divine operating assets.
- b. The teaching ministry of the Holy Spirit which under delegated omnipotence we are enabled to understand divine thought through the mechanics of the Grace Apparatus for Perception.

John 14:26 - But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.

John 16:13 - But when He, the Holy Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all truth.

1 Corinthians 2:12 - We have not received the world's spirit [cosmic systems of perception such as rationalism or empiricism] but the human spirit from the source of God [the Holy Spirit] in order that we might have a permanent knowledge [oida: a synonym for epignosis or full knowledge] of things that have been graciously given to us by God.

1 Corinthians 2:13 - which things [systematic theology] we [the Flag Apostles] also speak, not by teaching [didaktos: by means of the Satanic Academy's system of rationalism and empiricism] from the source of man's wisdom, but by teaching [didaktos: by means of the Divine Academy's system of grace] from the source of the Holy Spirit, bringing together spiritual truth [Bible doctrine] to a spiritual system [pneumatikos: in the neuter referring to a system, i.e., GAP].

Galatians 5:22 - The fruit of the Holy Spirit is love, happiness, tranquility, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

Galatians 5:23 - gentleness, self-control ...

Galatians 5:25 - If we live by means of the Holy Spirit, let us also walk [execute the Christian way of life] by means of the Holy Spirit.
